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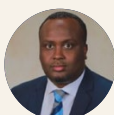

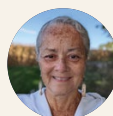

Throughout the year, CMSM made great strides
towards a campus expansion

As the Museum begins a major expansion, the time is right to reinforce the strategic foundations of the organization and consolidate its ideas around children's play and learning. Therefore, CMSM is engaged in a robust planning process to explore and understand the strategic, learning, and visitor experience implications of its expansion.

The CMSM retained museum planning experts, Jeanne Vergeront and Jim Roe to define a new Strategic Master Plan through an 18-month planning process conducted in three phases. Phase I: Museum Expansion Framework; Phase II: Visitor Experience Plan; Phase III: Implementation Plan.

A committee of nine community and Museum representatives recently wrapped up Phase One guided by Jim and Jeanne. By combining a

Strategic Framework with a Play and Learning Framework, this Expansion Master Plan fulfills important planning objectives.

Renderings of the new CMSM campus included expanded outdoor play to be utilized year-round, a new neurodiversity learning center, and additional staff workspaces.

Thank you to the planning committee members for your time, passion and ideas.

FIRE SAFETY DAY

The Children's Museum of Southern Minnesota hosted a Free Family Play day highlighting Fire Safety Education last August. Several area fire departments had fire trucks and emergency vehicles on site for kids to explore, as well as the smoke simulator house and Sparky the Fire Safety Dog, Smokey the Bear, a drone from the Blue Earth County

Sheriff's office, and fire safety education from the MN DNR.

The sponsors for the Fire Safety Education Day helped to make it possible for this to be a free day both for admission into CMSM and for all of the outdoor experiences. We had 801 people attend our event this year.



COMMUNITY PARTNERS

Mayo Clinic Health Systems

The CMSM's partnership with Mayo Clinic Health System provides opportunities for children and families to gain greater awareness about health and wellness and develop beneficial skills. This is accomplished through special events held at the Museum that allow MCHS residents to engage with children and families through impactful play.

Open Door Health Clinic

Earlier this year, the CMSM partnered with the Open Door Health Clinic to host a free family fun night. In addition to an evening of play, children and families were also greeted by dental professionals for free screenings, giveaways, and information on dental health.

Feeding Our Community Partners

This past June, the CMSM partnered with Feeding Our Community Partners (FOCP) through their Summer Backpack Food Program. The CMSM provided 1000 One-Day Family Free Passes to include in each backpack, providing a free day of play to families that otherwise might not be able to visit the Museum. Between June and October, more than 50 of these passes had already been redeemed!

The Museum hosts several Agriculture & Nature Initiatives that show the rich exhibits and programs that support a deeper understanding on how agriculture is a part of life here in the South Central Minnesota region.

One of the pillars of CMSM is our Agriculture Education with focus on learning where our food comes from and opportunities to understand our regional agriculture industry and how this impacts all.

We also had several visiting animals, including:

- goats from O'Malley Farms and Ruby Ranch
- horses from Pinewood Stables
- pigs from Christensen Farms
- cows from Yost Farms
- Hasse Farms Petting Zoo visited during Autumn Adventures in October

"Hosting visiting animals brings an opportunity for children to interact and experience animals with all their senses! We provide an opportunity to bring in those farmers and animal caretakers



to inform our guests about how they care for them, feed them, and then answer questions about how they become a part of our circle



of life,” said Kim Kleven, Vice President of Play and Learning.

Our gardens provide an opportunity to facilitate conversations about planting, growing, caring for, harvesting, and food accessibility. Children spend the summer helping to water the plants as they grow. During harvest season we encourage guests to pick the tomatoes, beans, and grapes and do taste testing. We have zucchini, squash, kale, and flowers for guests to take home to add to their mealtime prep. We are looking to expand these opportunities with the Living Earth Community Gardens bringing us more produce to share with families to utilize.

Other highlights include our Three Sisters Garden Experience. The Three Sisters Gardens use planting methods based on Native American gardening. The Three Sisters are corn, beans and squash.



Additional Ag Events

- Dairy Day: Celebrating National Dairy Month by having our visiting cows, local Dairy Princesses, and local Dairy Associations that provided Gogurts.
- We Dig Pigs: Hosted our visiting pigs and their providers, Martin Co. Pork Producers and Marty the Pig and the Minnesota Pork Producers Association / Minnesota Pork Board.



- Food From Farms: We hosted Wooden Spoon, South Central MN Food Recovery, and Living Earth Gardens to link families to the services these organizations provide. From using local producers to a network created to use food that would be discarded and getting it into the food supply chain again. Opportunities were bountiful to learn about gardening and sustainable food options.

Baby Play

Baby Play has been an inspiration for us to highlight the Museum's Infant & Toddler Play Porch and all it has to offer children 0-36 months. Sensory bins, puppets, loose parts, peek-a-boo boxes, and musical instruments are just a few of the things we have offered. Baby Play is a great time for parents and caregivers of small ones to socialize and share experiences - milestones and hardships, they are all part of parenting! Baby play is led by program facilitators who have backgrounds and a passion for early childhood development!

Young Explorers

Young Explorers is a weekly program for toddlers and preschoolers - although anyone at the museum is welcome to participate. This program focuses on play schemas, which are repeated themes in children's natural play, and nature and place based learning which explores the outside world far and near. Children need autonomy in their play so these sessions are open ended and offer a variety of materials to explore
