CASE STUDY

The Olilo Family



In April of 2022, the Olilo family welcomed daughter Maylie into the world. Her arrival coincided with Franck's pursuit of a master's in statistical analysis at Minnesota State University, Mankato, while Faith was working as a pharmacy technician. Franck, originally from Ivory Coast in Western Africa, encountered employment barriers with his student visa. Faith, a Mankato native, highlighted the financial challenges during Franck's student years, including living costs, childcare, and the delicate juggling act of balancing schedules.

Faith learned about the Gateway to Play Scholarship through her mother, who shared the opportunity as the weather turned colder and Maylie became more mobile. Initially hesitant, Faith felt encouraged by the chance to give her fivemonth-old Maylie an outlet for her energy. Though she worried about taking a spot from a family in greater need, she recognized the program as a valuable step toward stability for her own family.

The Gateway to Play Scholarship brought immediate relief, eliminating the financial worry that often accompanies outings with a young child. The program offered more than just access to the Museum; it became a sanctuary for play, fostering peace of mind for the Olilo family. Through Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE) playdates, the Olilos connected with other families, establishing a sense of community that extended beyond the Museum walls.

Maylie's formative years unfolded in the Infant and Toddler Play Porch, where she not only developed motor skills but also gained confidence. It was within the welcoming confines of this exhibit that Maylie achieved a significant milestone—learning to navigate up and down stairs (which their family apartment did not offer), a feat celebrated by her family. The Infant and Toddler Play Porch quickly became the Olilo family's favored destination, playing an instrumental role in fostering Maylie's cognitive and emotional growth.

As Maylie continues to embark on her journey of growth, she has graduated to scaling the heights of the Mankato Clinic Tree of Forts and exploring the Dotson Back 40 and the H20GO Water Gallery. These diverse experiences, marked by occasional wardrobe changes after spirited adventures, contribute significantly to Maylie's confidence, adventurous spirit, and natural curiosity.

Faith highlighted the peace of mind that the Gateway to Play Scholarship brought to their family, providing a safe and affordable space for Maylie to play. The program's reliability and affordability ensured that the Olilos could always count on a safe and engaging environment.

Maylie's experiences at the Museum extended beyond play—they enhanced her patience and understanding of other children, fostering social awareness and development. The Museum's sense of community became their place for playdates, offering routine and a chance for the Olilos to connect with other parents. The community at the Museum provided emotional support and a platform for shared parenting experiences.

The Olilo family's story serves as a testament to the

transformative power of inclusive play and community building. Living in a small apartment, the Museum became an ideal location for playdates, fostering connections and joy. Looking ahead, Faith eagerly anticipates the opportunity to give back and support families like hers through the Gateway to Play Scholarship.

Engaging young minds through play

Whenever a new program is piloted, there are many moving parts to consider. Just getting all those moving parts to launch successfully can be a feat in itself. When our Education & Programming team started to develop a camp concept the name Curiosity Camps was an easy decision. The definition for curiosity is a "quality related to inquisitive thinking such as exploration, investigation, and learning." Our desire was to create a program that would meet these qualities for the children. Our second goal was to provide additional options for high-quality experiences when school is not in session and families are looking for care.

As we wrap up our "pilot" year of Curiosity Camps we reflect on the many successes and joys that came out of the year. We welcomed 238 campers to join us for different experiences such as: "Innovations in Action", "Solve

It", and "Tech Tinkerers". We collaborated with community partners, volunteers, and worked hard to create fun and engaging experiences for children to engage in. 3M employees from New Ulm's plant brought in a "rocket launch" experience, our OKIES sewing volunteers helped campers sew projects, and a favorite day was spent playing with slime... lots of slime!

Led by highly qualified Museum staff who are Minnesota Licensed Educators, each camp ensured a high-quality experience for all participants, combining developmentally appropriate content with an emphasis on creativity and enjoyment. Feedback from families was overwhelmingly positive, with parents praising the camps as valuable experiences that allowed children to return home full of stories, new knowledge, and friendships.

Our programs are always morphing to engage visitors, whether they visit occasionally or nearly every day.

To kick off the start of summer, we hosted **ROCK N READ** with the Teddy Bear Band.

Next up was **NOT A BOX DAY**, where students used their imagination to make various creations out of cardboard boxes and other materials.

Art was a significant focus this year, with a **VISITING ARTISTS** and **PLAYING WITH ART** series. Six artists were selected to lead separate Saturday morning art-making sessions in Cecil's Imagineering Loft throughout June and July. The **KIDS ART SHOW** was the culminating event and showcased masterpieces from area children.

We also hosted several **THERAPY DOG** visits throughout the year.

POLLINATOR PROGRAM

In June, we started the pollinator season in the Butterfly House by ordering monarch larvae and watching them transform into butterflies. From that point on, the butterflies laid eggs and we raised monarchs throughout the summer. This year, we even added Painted Lady butterflies! July brought an abundance of monarchs leading to the rehoming of 385 caterpillars. Guests could also take caterpillars home or join our 3-day pollinator camp to learn about supporting pollinators. In August we tagged and released monarchs to track their migration to Mexico with guests and sponsors participating in the event.
